

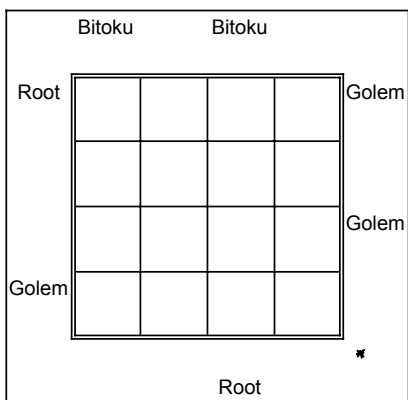
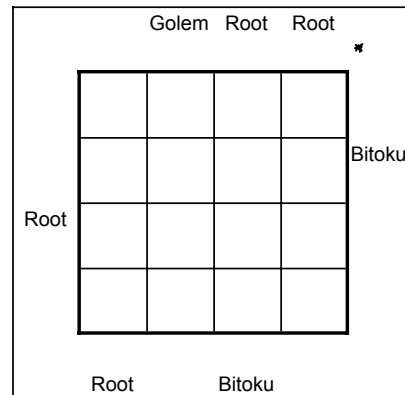
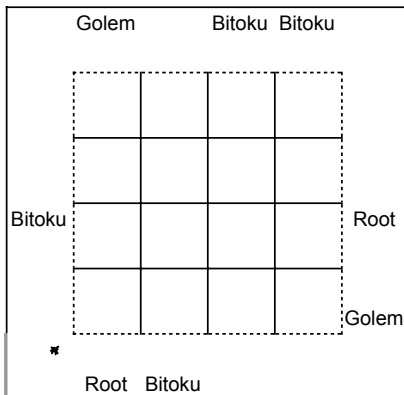
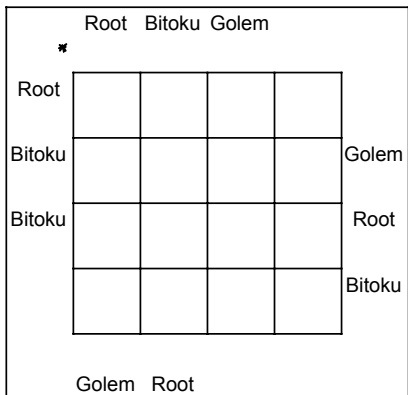
**Subject: RE: Is this some kind of game?**

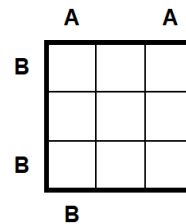
In the tables where they aren't playing a game, there seems to be a lively discussion going on. What's the topic?



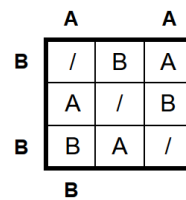
