Refer to the inset example below as follows:


Put the letters from the quotes into nodes so that the whole phrase can be made by tracing one path.

A letter may only appear ONCE in a graph.


You MAY retrace your path.

You MAY stay on a node to repeat a letter.


The attributions (names and movie/tv show) are NOT part of the puzzle.






